*******CODE OF CONDUCT*******

The NorthEast Youth Sheep Show has become, over the last 26 years, a very successful and large event. In order to ensure the quality of this event, the education of the youth and their families and promote sheep and agriculture to the general public, the show's sponsors are endorsing the National Show Ring Code of Ethics. It is each family's responsibility to read this Code and follow these guidelines. The Rule Enforcement Committee will review any complaints or actions deemed to violate these ethics. **THE RULE ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE WILL ONLY RECOGNIZE A COMPLAINT WHICH IS WRITTEN AND SIGNED AND BROUGHT FORTH BY A YOUTH SHOW EXHIBITOR OR A YOUTH SHOW COMMITTEE MEMBER.** It is very important to the show management that youths conduct themselves with respect for themselves, their animals and people around them. Any action that violates these ethics will be grounds for disqualification from the show and possible immediate dismissal from the show grounds:

- a) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials, before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect, and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- b) No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this Code of Conduct or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this Code of Conduct. Violation of this Rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

*******MASSACHUSETTS ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS*******

2010 Fairs Animal Health Rules

NO animal will be admitted to the fairgrounds unless it meets the requirements below. NO animal is to be unloaded or enter a barn or tie-out stall until the animal and its paperwork have been inspected and approved for entry.

General Rules for All Animals

1. All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds will not be approved for entry.
2. Evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease or failure to produce the necessary documents for health certification, vaccination or testing will result in the animal's rejection for entry. **THE INSPECTOR'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
3. **REMINDER:** ALL sheep and goats of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo, or electronic implant consistent with the requirements of the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06. Information on approved tags, tattoos and electronic implants is available from the USDA APHIS office in Sutton, MA at 508-363-2290.
4. All livestock must have proper ID. For animals identified by microchip, readers must be available to the Inspectors.
5. **SEE INDIVIDUAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES LISTED BELOW.**

B. Out of State Animals

1. All animals entering a Massachusetts fairground from out of state must be accompanied by a valid health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian certifying that the animals are clinically free of infectious or contagious disease and exposure from such disease. Documents of health certification must be written on relevant state or federal health forms only. These certificates must be available upon request to fair inspectors.

2. Health certificates must be dated January 1, 2010 or later. These documents will be acceptable for the entire fair season in Massachusetts. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-Accredited or Brucellosis-Free, then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Bureau of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795).

Sheep

1. Sheep entering a Massachusetts fairground must have a valid health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian certifying that the animals are clinically free of infectious or contagious disease and exposure from such disease. Documents of health certification for out of state animals must be written on relevant state or federal health forms only. In-state animals may be accompanied by a certificate of examination on a veterinarian's letterhead stationery which clearly identifies the contact information for the veterinarian signing the certification. Certificates written on plain paper are not acceptable. These certificates must be available upon request to fair inspectors. Health certificates must be dated January 1, 2010 or later. These documents will be acceptable for the entire fair season.

2. No sheep will be allowed entry from flocks in which Scrapie has been diagnosed or in which animals are under surveillance for Scrapie during the previous eighteen months. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP) and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06, sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within the state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo, or electronic implant consistent with requirements of the FSEP. Information on approved tags, tattoos, and electronic implants is available from the USDA APHIS office in Sutton, MA at 508-363-2290.

3. No sheep will be permitted entry from flocks in which Soremouth has existed or in which Soremouth Vaccine has been administered in the previous sixty days.

4. Sheep must be free from visual evidence of foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye, ringworm, and open and draining wounds.

5. While not required, it is strongly recommended that sheep be currently vaccinated against rabies.

*****RULES & REGULATIONS*****

EACH EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR READING THESE RULES & BEING FAMILIAR WITH THEM.

1. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury and/or damages done by or arising from any animal exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the New England Sheep & Wool Growers Association and the NorthEast Youth Sheep Show against legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Upon this condition only are entries accepted.
2. This show is open to all youths 21 years old and under **as of January 1** of the current year.
3. All sheep must be registered in the name of the exhibitor, or leased through an Official Lease Agreement Program with a copy of both sides of the registration papers attached to lease form, or owned in a Youth Partnership where all names are on the registration papers. No Partnerships with a farm or adult(s) are accepted. Partnerships are considered one exhibitor but any party in the partnership may enter in a Fitting & Showmanship class with a different sheep than the other partner(s). At least one partner must enter a Fitting & Showmanship class.
4. All sheep shown in group classes must be registered under the same name. Individuals in group classes must have been shown in single classes. Premiums limited to two per individual class and one per group class.
5. **Registration papers must be checked in between 8AM and 9AM on Friday BY THE YOUTH EXHIBITOR** with the individual breed secretary (specific tables will be set-up for checking in papers). **All Market Lambs must be checked in and WEIGH-IN by the youth exhibitor between 8 AM and 9 AM.** HEALTH AND REGISTRATION PAPERS AND LEASE AGREEMENTS MUST BE AVAILABLE THROUGHOUT THE WEEKEND TO BE SHOWN UPON REQUEST. Sales receipts may be used on recently purchased sheep. All sheep must be owned by July 1 of the current year except for sheep that are purchased in the New England Sale, which will be allowed to be shown in the respective breed class, BUT NOT FITTING & SHOWMANSHIP. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make a post entry or substitution with the breed secretary immediately following the Sale. THE ONLY POST ENTRIES ALLOWED ARE NEW ENGLAND SALE SHEEP. Exhibitors are still limited to two entries per individual class. EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO PRE-ENTER THE SHOW, AND MAY PURCHASE ADDITIONAL SHEEP THROUGH THE NEW ENGLAND SALE, WHICH MAY BE POST-ENTERED AND SHOWN IN BREED CLASSES ONLY.
6. All sheep must have the required identification as per order of their particular national breed organizations and the federal identification regulations. Registration papers and ear tag/tattoo numbers must match.
7. Humane treatment of animals is required at all times. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, use of muzzles, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited. Any complaints will be addressed individually. Sheep should be properly handled at all times, including loading and unloading of animals, and leading on halter.
8. All animals entered in this show will be subject to the inspection for evidence of infectious or contagious diseases, i.e. foot rot, fungus, sore mouth, pinkeye, etc. Evidence of these or other contagious/infectious diseases will result in animal's removal from the barn. Committee's decision will be final. If disputed, the veterinarian expense will be covered by exhibitor. ALL SHEEP MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN APPROPRIATE INTERSTATE HEALTH CERTIFICATE FROM THE STATE OF ORIGIN. Prior entry permits are not required for show purposes.
9. Showing sheep on a halter is optional. (Breed Secretaries do encourage inexperienced and younger showman to use halters.) All animals must be washed, except for wool breeds which must be properly prepared for show.

10. All exhibitors must be clean and neat. **Proper attire for the show rings: FOR FRIDAY MARKET LAMB CLASSES AND SATURDAY FITTING & SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES will be a solid white shirt or 4-H solid white shirt tucked in at all times, with long solid-colored pants in good repair** (no sweats, tank tops or revealing attire allowed). **NOTE: ON SUNDAY THE PROPER ATTIRE FOR SHOWRING WILL BE 2010 NEYSS ISSUED T-SHIRTS, WITH LONG SOLID-COLORED PANTS IN GOOD REPAIR – THIS SHALL BE WORN BY ALL EXHIBITORS ALL DAY.** Proper foot attire must be worn at all times.
11. Non-refundable entry fee is \$2 per head. No entry fee is required for Fitting & Showmanship. Fees are forfeited if animals do not show. Entry fee **MUST ACCOMPANY** entry form. Any entries received with no payment will be subject to double entry fees paid at time of check-in. **MAKE CHECKS OUT TO: NESWGA.**
12. **ENTRY DEADLINE IS JULY 9, 2010**, except for New England Sale post entries (see item #5). **ALL ENTRIES AND FEES ARE TO BE MAILED TO: SCOTT POITRAS, 95 HOLLOW ROAD, BRIMFIELD, MA 01010.**
13. Grain, hay, bedding and water pails **MUST BE** furnished by the exhibitor. All animals must be properly bedded and watered at ALL TIMES. No carpeting allowed.
14. All lambs must have lamb's teeth. Yearlings cannot have more than 4 permanent teeth in use.
15. A breed must meet the minimum requirements to show as an individual breed of three (3) exhibitors and ten (10) breeding sheep as of Thursday, July 15 at 11PM
16. Fitting & Showmanship Class participation is **MANDATORY** for all exhibitors. All age divisions will show individually by breed **EXCEPT** Market Lamb Fitting & Showmanship which will be shown separately, one Market Lamb Fitting & Showmanship Class per age group. Classes will be split as follows: **FIRST YEAR** - showmen who are showing sheep for the **first year, EVER, ANYWHERE**; **NOVICE** - 9 years old and under as of January 1; **JUNIOR** - 10 years old through 14 years of age as of January 1; and **SENIOR** - 15 years old through 21 years of age as of January 1. There will be an overall Supreme Fitting & Showmanship class for each age group with the top winners in each breed competing for the overall trophy of a stenciled Captain's Chair, donated by Telescope Casual Furniture. The First Year and Novice Divisions will be judged in the Danish system.
17. **LIMITED HELP FOR EXHIBITORS IN PREPARATION FOR SHOW WHILE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS WILL BE ALLOWED WITH PERMISSION OF GUARDIAN, BREED SECRETARY AND SHOW CHAIRMEN** (*This show "officially starts" on Thursday at 11PM, and therefore these rules apply beginning at 11PM on Thursday and continuing Friday, Saturday, and through end of show on Sunday*). If an exhibitor feels he/she needs some instructional help, they should see the breed secretary first. Violators should be brought to the attention of the Rule Enforcement Committee immediately by a Youth Show Exhibitor or Youth Show Committee Member. **ALL COMPLAINTS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED TO RULE ENFORCING COMMITTEE IN WRITING AND SIGNED BY COMPLAINANT. AFTER THE FIRST WARNING ANY FURTHER VIOLATIONS WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION.**
18. To help defray costs of facility rental, camping space will be available with electrical and water hook-ups at \$25 prepaid to NESWGA c/o Scott Poitras for this event, with all fence line parking being chargeable. Post paid fee is \$40 and will be collected upon arrival at show, if not a prepaid camper. See form enclosed.
19. **EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR SHOWING AT THE HEAD OF AT LEAST ONE OF HIS OR HER ANIMALS IN ALL INDIVIDUAL CLASSES.** (*This means each exhibitor must be holding the head of one of his or her own animals in all classes in which his or her animals are shown.*)
20. It is the responsibility of the youth exhibitor to participate in **ALL** required events. This includes the orientation and final exhibitors meetings, fitting & showmanship class, and any championship drive the exhibitor qualifies for. If the youth does not participate in **ALL** required events, **ALL** premiums will be forfeited.
21. Lights in the barn will be in limited use after dark.
22. **NO DOGS ALLOWED IN THE BARN.** Owner at risk.
23. Animals must remain penned until the Final Exhibitor's Meeting is concluded or premiums will be forfeited and/or future entry denied.
24. Premiums will be paid within 21 days of the show. If a violation of this rule occurs, contact the NEYSS Co-Chairmen.
25. Rule Enforcing Committee has the final say on all rules and regulations, and is responsible for enforcing the same.
26. **ALL JUDGES' DECISIONS ARE FINAL.**

*******SUPREME CHAMPION AWARDS*******

The Supreme Champion Market Lamb will receive a Banner given in Memory of Ed Peckham, who was a founding member of the North East Youth Show. The banner is made and donated by Claudette Choma. The North East Youth Sheep Show Committee gives blankets lettered by Claudette Choma for the winning Supreme Champion Market Lamb, Reserve Champion Market Lamb, Highly Commended Market Lamb and Commended Market Lamb. Supreme Champion Market Lamb winner also receives a \$100 award donated by Don Chase of Chase's Pennell Hill Farm.

Supreme Champion Ram, Supreme Champion Ewe and Supreme Flock selections will be made following the breed classes on Sunday afternoon. All Champion Rams from each breed will be competing for the Supreme Ram award; all Champion Ewes from each breed will compete for the Supreme Ewe award; and all first place Flocks in each breed will compete for the Supreme Flock award. The Supreme Champion Ram and Supreme Champion Ewe winners each receive \$100 donated by Don Chase of Chase's Pennell Hill Farm. The Supreme Flock winner will receive \$100 donated by Claudette Choma. The Supreme Ram winner receives a banner in Memory of Ernest Flebotte, and the Supreme Ewe winner receives a banner in Memory of

Phyllis Flebotte. Mr. and Mrs. Flebotte were founding members of the North East Youth Show. The Supreme Flock winner receives a banner in Honor of Dan Korngiebel, a continued great supporter of this show. All banners are made and donated by Claudette Choma.

Grand Champion Fleece will receive a banner made and donated by Claudette Choma along with a \$75 cash award donated by Don Chase of Chase's Pennell Hill Farm.

*******EIGHTH ANNUAL QUIZ BOWL CONTEST*******
